

It is that time of the year again, no sooner do we leave the heat of summer and the children go back to school, then Christmas decorations start to sneak into the shops and before long adverts onto our TV screens.

Why are we in such a rush to embrace Christmas?

As I write (in October) we are thinking about our Service of Thanksgiving for Loved Ones and the annual Service of Remem-

brance, where we pray for those who have been lost in wars and conflict and for peace in our times. Surely Christmas should be far from our minds?

Christmas will come as it always does, but is our hurry for it to do with our excitement for Jesus or the need for something to look forward to. The time of year when we are with family and friends, presents, good food and all the trappings of a celebration or because we are searching for something that is missing in our world and lives?

Make this time a time of prayer.


You may even want to buy an advent calendar that tells the story of Jesus and reminds us what advent is all about.

It is almost that time again when we start rummaging in the loft or the garage to locate all those Christmas decorations. Out come shiny reindeer, red velvet coated Santas and strings of lights (will they work this year?) and endless brightly coloured baubles.

My "thing" has always been my Nativity scene which covers the sideboard and has been added to over the years on my travels or purchases on a whim; I have a pie man, a woman selling fish, 2 small metal horses and a whole herd of camels.





But last, and certainly not least, comes The Tree!

Be it window-sill or room-size, be it artificial or real - there has to be a Tree!

We always have a magnificent one in church lovingly decorated and surrounded by tempting packages. Where I used to live, two churches had Christmas Tree festivals when church groups decorated small trees and the money raised by visitors went to local charities.

During their midwinter festival, when the world was cold and dark and covered with snow the Romans brought in sheaves of evergreen to decorate their homes. It encouraged them to think of a time when their lands would become green and fruitful again. The early Scandinavians decorated their houses and barns with evergreen to ward off the devil.

This original pagan custom has now been adapted and grown into a Christian tradition; after all I suspect that many of us do not believe that Jesus was actually born on the 25 December, simply that the fore-sighted Christians adapted an existing pagan festival to bring new hope to the world.





Tel: 01772 815539 or Mobile 07798760127 It is said that the idea of lights on the tree came from Martin Luther, the great reformer, when he saw stars twinkling through the branches of an evergreen, so he added candles to his tree. Many of our tree baubles are red. These are said to represent the apples on the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden which the serpent tempted Eve to eat, thus leading to mankind being cast out into the world. The imagery of round, red apples hanging on the tree was used in the mediaeval mystery plays.



On top of the tree proudly stands the star which led the Wise Men (non-Jews like us) to the Christ-child and to the Saviour of the world.

The Christmas tree as a family ornament started its life in the Germanic countries and was brought over in early Victorian times and remains a staple of our Christmas celebrations.

(If you're already concerned about taking your decorations down, then the standard date seems to be 5 January, Twelfth Night, before the Three Kings appear on 6 January - Epiphany. If however, you want to extend your festive season there is a strong mediaeval tradition in which 2 February - Candlemas, marks the end of the Christmas season and the church is filled with candles to bless the New Year. **Be warned!** That same tradition says that decorations left up after Candlemas will become possessed by goblins!!)

We obviously need to remember that the second tree in the Bible was the tree on which Christ was crucified and died for each and every one of us; a debt that we must never forget. The Symbol of the Tree carries us from the beginning of the story to its earthly end. The evergreen represents hope, life and renewal through the darkest days of the year and often our lives. It stands firm to remind us that Christ is everlasting, true and faithful, and will never



leave us nor forsake us.....and even as I write this the power of that message takes all my breath away.

Sunday School

This has given us a more relaxed feeling and has led to better discussions and prayer times.



We welcome all children age 0-11ish for fun, games, songs, Bible teaching, prayer and crafts and we're always keen and happy to welcome new children along.

In September we had our first Family Church of the school year, asking the question WHY?

The children had the chance to think about all the different things we do in church and ask questions about church. There were some great questions asked about why our church is called St Michael's, what the word church means and many others. Mandy & I tried our best to answer them but sometimes had to resort to Googling the answers! During this service, we also wrote thanks and praise prayers on a graffiti wall, wrote sorry prayers and then burnt them to signify God's forgiveness to us, and as a visual reminder of God always forgiving us when we say sorry.

Schools Work

I regularly go into 3 of our local schools to deliver Collective Worship: Little Hoole & Holmeswood termly(ish) and St Michael's weekly. This gives us, as a church, a good chance to share Bible stories and what they mean to us and how they can help us be the very best version of ourselves that we can be. I am aware of the privilege I have, of speaking to over 350 children and their teachers regularly about God and the Bible.

I also run two lunchtime clubs at St Michael's: Worship Warriors and Christian Crafts. Worship Warriors look at the worship that happens in school and we try to make it accessible and helpful as possible. The Christian Craft group look at a Bible story related to my Collective Worship that week, and then we make crafts related to it. These two clubs are great for me to get to know the children a bit better, and for them to have another trusted, Christian adult in their lives.

Our work in the schools is a vital ministry, as it means that we are going to the place where children spend most of their waking time, and sharing God with them. It also means that when the children come to church for school services, or if they come to a regular service, or a baptism etc, they have a friendly, trusted and known face welcoming them when they come.

SPACE FOR PRAYER



In September Judy Beeston came along to talk about Edith Rigby, Preston's most famous Suffragette. Judy cleverly transported us into Edith's world. She came along in a replica of a dress and hat worn by Edith which made her story even more fascinating.

Edith Rigby was dedicated to improving the lives and conditions of young people and women in the early 20th century; initially she started up youth clubs in the



poor areas of Preston and, later, she was active in the Suffragette Movement – even going to prison and on hunger strike – believing in the strength of women being united. She married an amazingly tolerant man who allowed her to live her independent life! Judy was also a founder member and president of the local Hutton & Howick Women's Institute.

In October we welcomed the Men's Group to share reminiscences about life in England in the mid-1900s ("Those were the Days") from Ray Cauldwell. We were reminded of all sorts of post-war music, old radio programmes and the coming of television. The memories were all in our minds and just needed to be unlocked!
