


Our other set of grandchildren are in Preston so we will not be saying goodbye to the Northwest and indeed intend to visit frequently.

Dear Reader



St Michael's holds a special place in the hearts of many in our congregation and community. From joyful memories marking the milestones of life, from baptisms and weddings and confirmations; Christmas, Harvest and school services, and much more, to times of loss where the church has been a place of comfort and hope.

We are writing for two reasons:

The first is to say a warm and heartfelt thank you for the contributions you have made to St Michael's over the years. It is so good to know you value our church community and it is never taken for granted. Thank you.

The primary reason for writing is to ask for your support. Everything we do as a church is made possible by the generous giving of commitment, time, skills and money given week by week. However, St Michael's is now facing a significant financial challenge, and that's why we are asking for your help today.

Our Rector, the Revd Ann Templeman, is retiring in October, and we will soon be working with the Diocese to find her successor. St Michael's has been very fortunate because, like her predecessors over the past 15 years plus, Revd Templeman has not sought a stipend (salary) from the church during her ministry here. She has just claimed expenses and her home has been in the Rectory as part of the community.

However, in order to keep our independence as a church, with our own minister, and sustain the ministry which has grown over the last 5 and a half years, we now need to finance a "stipendiary" (paid) minister; ideally full-time but at the very least part-time at an annual cost of £40k and £20k respectively. This is essential if we are to continue the mission, pastoral care, children's and youth work that has grown during Revd Templeman's ministry but we cannot achieve this without an increase in our income. Paying a salary for a new Rector will be a big change for St Michael's, and we trust you will understand when we ask, on behalf of the Church Council, for your help and support.

If you would like to help us to keep St Michael's as an important part of our village community, and you are able to contribute, there are three ways you could make a difference:







CELEBRATING THE LOVE AND COURAGE OF MOTHERS (Extract from Mothering Sunday sermon March 2024)

Those of you who enjoy listening to smooth radio like Peter may have been amused to hear the Aldi advert which had the punchline 'Your mother would go to the earth for you . You only have to go to Aldi!'

Most of you here today are no doubt deeply grateful for your mothers – all the self sacrificial love they have lavished on you. And I expect many of them are or were truly wonderful women.

I heard the story of 2 remarkable mothers this week. The first was the mother of one of the members St Michael's whose funeral took place n this church on Tuesday. Her name was Majda and she lived 66 years in Hoole before she died a the age of 91. She was born however in what used to be Yugoslavia and is now Slovenia. Until 1939 she had a quiet and happy childhood in a small village living in a close knit community with her parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins, but as for millions of people throughout the world, her life changed when World War 2 broke out. In 1941 her peaceful life was shattered when the Italians occupied Yugoslavia. Soon after, they were followed by the German army, life then became even more difficult and dangerous under Nazi rule. Her school teachers 'disappeared' overnight and were replaced by German teachers.

The whole region was ruled by the dreaded Gestapo. The Slovenes could no longer speak their own language in public, everyone, including children, had to speak German. All public signs were now in German and all school lessons were conducted in German.

Majda's mother, Mila, was an active member of the Resistance Movement. Forging documents, passing on secret messages and hiding resistance fighters was now the norm for Majda. Eventually, the inevitable happened, Majda's mother was arrested and imprisoned by the Gestapo and was likely to face execution by firing squad.

Fortunately for Majda and her mother, but not for the Partisan Movement, an uncle by marriage betrayed his own people and worked for the Germans. Majda, about 8 or 9 years old at the time, begged him to use his influence with the Germans and have her mother released. This he did and despite Mila continuing to work for the Partisans, she was not arrested again.

So 2 wonderful courageous mothers: Majda who saved her mother from death at the age of 8 and her mother Mila who risked her life on a daily basis fighting for justice and freedom.

Now read Exodus 2 v 1-10 about the 3 amazing women in life of Moses whose selfless love rescued Moses from death which enabled Moses to rescue God's people from slavery in Egypt.

Holy Week at Hoole St Michael CE Primary School.

Honey Bees and Discovery Class: We really enjoyed Holy Week. We made bunting for Palm Sunday and talked about how exciting it would have been to be there to welcome Jesus. We then washed each other's feet just as Jesus did. We had a last supper thinking about how the disciples felt.





Station 1 Gethsemane: After listening to the story when Jesus was arrested, we chose a stone and prayed for courage to stand up for what is right. White ribbons were then tied to branches as we thought about how God gives us the strength we need.
